CAPITOL ALERT Orange County supervisor joins race for secretary of state

Orange County Supervisor Don Wagner announced his candidacy for California secretary of state, emphasizing a commitment to secure, accurate and accessible elections. The 64-year-old Republican is joined by former California secretaries of state Bill Jones and Bruce McPherson, who will serve as his campaign co-chairs.

"I want to run for secretary of state because I believe the state of California can do better," Wagner said. "It can do better in assuring our voters that our elections are free and fair."

A key priority for Wagner is restoring the "damaged trust" in the election system. He strongly endorses the California Voter ID initiative, expected on the November 2026 ballot.

Currently, 36 other states require voter identification at the polls. Wagner noted that there's no drop in participation with the check implemented. A 2008 CalTech study revealed that there is no evidence that voter identification affects participation in the polls.

While Wagner personally said he doesn't believe fraud exists in California elections, he said the voter ID initiative can help encourage people to vote.

"You've got that additional check and balance there," Wagner said. "And the other thing it will do, and this has flown under the radar screen, it will add to people's confidence."

He also raised concerns about the time-consuming ballot counting process, particularly how mail-in ballots can take more time with signature matches.

"We're now past COVID, we need to dial back on that because we are seeing a challenge to the integrity of the system or the voters' belief in the integrity of the system, either of which is bad," he said.

With experience as a state Assembly member, Irvine mayor and Orange County board of supervisors chairman, Wagner highlighted his readiness to tackle the responsibilities of the secretary of state's office, notably supporting California businesses. He added that the business filings department is the largest part of the secretary of state's office.

More specifically, Wagner said, California could leverage its technology use better when approaching the business climate, especially with Silicon Valley's expertise, to streamline processes for business owners.

"There's no reason a business owner in California should have those hurdles, especially not with technology as it is today," he said.

GOVERNOR PETE WILSON ENDORSES DON WAGNER FOR SECRETARY OF STATE

Will also serve as Honorary Campaign Chairman

Orange County, Calif. -- Orange County Supervisor Don Wagner received the endorsement of Governor Pete Wilson for his campaign for Secretary of State. Pete Wilson, a two-term Governor of California from 1991 to 1999 and two term United States Senator, also agreed to serve as Supervisor Wagner's Honorary Campaign Chairman. Governor Wilson is known for many significant achievements during his tenure, and for leaving the state of California in a better position by focusing on economic recovery which led to a significant reduction in the state's budget deficit. He also implemented tax cuts and reforms that contributed to job creation and economic expansion. Only one month since entering the race, Supervisor Wagner has secured the support of not only Governor Wilson but two past Secretaries of State -- Bill Jones (Republican) and Bruce McPherson (No Party Preference) -- who will serve as active Campaign Chairs. Additionally, the Wagner campaign enjoys support from Democrat and Republican leaders from around the state at all levels of government. Additional endorsements will be forthcoming as Wagner challenges the incumbent, a Gavin Newsom appointee, who has had weak financial support while championing far left positions on issues ranging from public safety to budgetary giveaways.

Supervisor Wagner is a former Assemblyman, Mayor of Irvine, and College Board of Trustee who was elected Chairman twice by a Democrat majority Board of Supervisors. Wagner has a distinguished career of public service and a well-earned reputation as a straight shooter, fiscal watchdog, and champion for families, small businesses, veterans and first responders.

REPUBLICAN SECRETARY OF STATE DON WAGNER CALLS OUT SACRAMENTO POLITICIANS FOR COSTLY SPECIAL ELECTION AND UNWILLINGNESS TO IMPLEMENT ELECTION SAFEGUARDS

Orange County, Calif. -- Republican Secretary of State candidate Don Wagner issued the following statement in response to news that the November 4th Special Election will potentially cost more than \$280,000,000:

Two hundred and eighty million dollars! That is how much the Governor and his legislative enablers want to spend on the gerrymandering Special Election assault on voter integrity, the California budget is in disarray. Gavin Newsom and the Sacramento ruling party ran up a \$12 billion deficit that they "closed" in July with accounting gimmicks and rosy revenue projections. Now as their budget falls apart, they are talking about a Special Legislative Session in the Fall to again deal with the budget they supposedly fixed in July. And none of that stops them from wasting \$280 million tax dollars on Newsom's vanity project: giving politicians a safe back room to gerrymander the state.

I'm running for Secretary of State to work on behalf of the voters and taxpayers of this state because someone has to be their voice. Prop 50's cost estimate is just the latest news that voters and taxpayers are getting a raw deal. My opponent, the Newsom-appointed Shirley Weber, is just going to sit back and go along with the Governor without standing up for the people who elected her.

The fact of the matter is none of these politicians have the best interests of the voters in mind; Newsom's political rhetoric and Shirley Weber's enabling of that rhetoric will cost voters and taxpayers dearly.

If we want to save our Democracy, we need to start protecting the security of our elections and the first step to that should be to implement processes that prohibit ineligible voters from voting.

Just last week the Democrats on my Board of Supervisors blocked attempts to investigate a situation where a dog was registered to vote and even cast a ballot in two elections. During that debate one of them stated she would be more motivated to remove ineligible voters from the voter rolls if they "don't support my core values."


This is the type of mentality we have to change throughout California -- voter integrity should come first and foremost.

DON WAGNER

A LIFE COMMITTED TO FAMILY, SERVICE, LEADERSHIP

Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Donald P. Wagner is the oldest of Don and Paula Wagner's four children. In the mid-sixties, the Wagner family moved to the San Fernando Valley, then to Tennessee, finally returning to California to stay when Don was 12 years old. He met his future wife, Megan, at their public high school in Ventura County. Megan and Don both attended UCLA, where Don received his Bachelor of Arts degree. Don earned his Juris Doctor from the University of California College of the Law, San Francisco. Coming of political age during Ronald Reagan's presidency, Don understood the importance and allure of robust personal liberty and opportunity. He also saw firsthand what it took to bring the nation back to its feet after the malaise of the Carter years with its long gas lines, high taxes, and international crises.





In 1987, Don began his legal career as a business lawyer at a Los Angeles and Orange County law firm. In 1993, Don started his own firm, Wagner, Lautsch LLP, advising business and real estate clients. Don served on several committees for the Orange County Bar Association and as a Judge Pro-Tempore in the Orange County Superior Court. He also founded and served as the first President of the OC Chapter of the Federalist Society, a national organization of lawyers, judges, and law professors that promotes judicial integrity and strict adherence to the US Constitution. Don was elected in 1998 as a member of the South County Community College District Board of Trustees. Of his twelve years on the Board, Don served six as Board President, where he balanced every budget and paid off all debts without raising taxes or burdening the public with bonds.

From 2010 to 2016, Don was elected to serve in the California State Assembly. As a member of the State Assembly, Don Wagner served on numerous committees such as Aging and Long-Term Care, Appropriations, Budget, Education, and as Vice Chair of the Judiciary Committee. On the financial committees, Don oversaw all state spending and revenue, quickly earning a reputation for expertise in government fiscal affairs.

In 2016, he was elected Mayor of Irvine. In 2017, Mayor Wagner fulfilled his promise to the citizens of Irvine and led the effort to build out the Great Park after \$200 million had been wasted under prior city councils. Because of Don's leadership, the Great Park is now home to world-class sports and cultural amenities.

Don served as Mayor until 2019 when he was elected to the OC Board of Supervisors. He has served as Vice Chairman of the Board from 2022 to 2023 and Chairman from 2023 to January 2025. Shortly after taking office in 2019, Supervisor Wagner brought together multiple entities to reopen Irvine Lake for shoreline fishing, without additional cost to taxpayers and after the lake had been closed for three years. The Orange County Register named him one of OC's Most Influential People in recognition for his leadership. In 2020, Don identified and allocated funding to process a 30-year backlog of sexual assault evidence kits at the County of Orange, which led to the prosecution of a longtime sex offender and the identification of perpetrators on national sex offender registries and the processing of over 1,500 backlogged rape kits which was completed by the fall of 2021. Evidencing his ability to work across the aisle while holding onto his conservative values, Don was elected twice to the position of Board Chairman by a Democratic-controlled body. Don has been credited with numerous "promises made and promises kept" accomplishments.

Don's most important public project, begun during his time in the legislature and continuing now on the Board of Supervisors, is to ensure that Orange County is home to a Military Cemetery for all those who have worn our country's uniform and given so much to us all. In addition to his work, Wagner serves on the board of Angel Force USA which is dedicated to raising awareness about suicide in the military.

Don has served on numerous boards and commissions during his service to Orange County including the Fire Authority, Transportation Authority, Southern California Assoc. of Governments, and the Orange County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, giving him a breadth of knowledge and experience in issues that affect the day-to-day lives of all Californians.

A recent cancer survivor, Don has consistently demonstrated a can-do attitude and belief in addressing problems headon. He aggressively works to find agreement where possible though has never been one to "go along to get along". Don believes the key to good governance is to look for common ground and not make policy disputes personal. But while Don is always willing to listen to and work with people of all viewpoint, he is not willing to compromise his core values in the name of political expediency.

Don and Megan, now married over 40 years, raised and educated three children in the Orange County public school system. Don and Megan coached youth baseball, softball, and soccer and held leadership roles in a youth swim league and Indian Guides and Indian Princesses. They are now the grandparents of two and are avid babysitters. While they are passionate UCLA sports fans, Don roots for the Angels and Ducks, but also for the Dodgers given his time in Los Angeles and the Steelers from his hometown of Pittsburgh. An English major with a robust grounding in the classics and a love of history, Don is an avid reader, having cruised through War & Peace twice, and all of Shakespeare. His approach to governance is summarized in a quote from Leviticus which is inscribed on the Liberty Bell:

"Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof."


